



Aging Through Traumatic Stress: Analyzing the Effects of Traumatic Stress and Race on Alzheimer's Disease

Course Description: Recent studies have shown there is a higher rate of Alzheimer's Disease among BIPOC, particularly African Americans and Latinos. This LIVE INTERACTIVE Webinar workshop teaches social and cultural competency in dementia care while exploring the potential risk factors that increase the likelihood of dementia, especially from the effects of racial traumatic stress on the brain. This encompasses healthcare disparities, housing and food insecurity, and racial microaggressions experienced on a daily basis. Outcomes from the studies discussed exemplifies the need for additional research, and the development of specialized screening tools for racial trauma among older adults. This workshop is fully interactive. Attendees may ask and answer questions throughout the presentation and participate in instructor-led discussions, as well as case vignette discussions, and a Q&A session at the end.

From this workshop you will learn to:

1. Develop a foundational understanding of dementia-related illnesses.
2. Demonstrate the effects of untreated psychological trauma among older adults with dementia.
3. Recognize the importance of screening for Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder among older adults.
4. Identify effective interventions to treat Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, and when it is appropriate for older adults with dementia.

6:00pm-6:15pm – Gain foundational understanding of Alzheimer's disease which includes risk factors and who is most susceptible.

6:15pm-7:00pm – Explore disparities among Americans and highlight discrimination for BIPOC.

7:00pm-7:45pm – Learn about trauma, race-based traumatic stress, and how cumulative trauma affects older BIPOC – increasing the risk of dementia.

7:45pm-8:00pm – Examine the need for additional research and clinical interventions including screening tools specific to race-based traumatic stress.
